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Filomena Vergara, 73 years old and her sister Ema Vergara, 67 years old, have been supporting themselves working with natural wool for over 30 years. They are part of a group of about 20 women in their community in southern Chile; some of the skills they share include spinning yarn, dyeing yarn, embroidering and doing needlepoint.

Bringing to market a complete product that has been ethically manufactured with the highest standard has been the goal.

Isabel Garreton promotes skills and craftsmanship of artisans, who are at risk of not being able to address the basic need to earn a living. In the process bringing about an homage to traditions that hold communities together, perpetuating skills that speak loudly of touch to a world that worships technology but feels nostalgia for a time and place, hard to experience, full of human content.

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
